PRIOR KNOWLEDGE/SKILLS REQUIRED:

No experience is required but it would be beneficial to bring along some sketches and ideas of prints that you might like to make.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course acts as a workshop for people with some or no printmaking skills. It concentrates on simple but effective methods of printing so you can develop your own ideas and work towards a portfolio of printed images. Prints will be made in oil-based inks using presses in most cases. The aim for students is to be experimental and explorative once techniques have been learnt or to develop one's own approach to making prints.

EQUIPMENT NEEDED:

- An apron
- A sketchbook
- Sketches or images with you to inspire your prints
