

DURATION, DAY, DATE AND TIME OF THE COURSE:

20 weeks starting Tuesday 7 January 2025, 10:00-14:30.

VENUE:

East Surrey College, Gatton Point, London Road, Redhill RH1 2JX.

PRIOR KNOWLEDGE/SKILLS REQURIED:

This course is ideal for learners who have completed a level 1 qualification or have some floristry flower arranging experience. A reasonable standard of literacy, numeracy and IT skills are essential to help complete the theory elements of this course, i.e., the ability to read and interpret written tasks, to write answers and complete documents in a legible and understandable form, to carry out research tasks, organize information and to make simple calculations using a calculator. As this course is a craft course, that has lots of practical sections, a degree of manual dexterity is necessary. All candidates will need to take a standard online numeracy/literacy assessment to ascertain suitability and any support needs for this course and attend a short induction.

WHAT QUALIFICATIONS WILL I GET?

NCFE level 2 Certificate in Floristry

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The NCFE Level 2 Certificate in Floristry is ideal for students wanting to pursue a career within the floristry sector or for those wishing to expand and update their knowledge and improve their floral designs. You will focus on the skills and techniques required to produce commercial floral designs, bouquets and arrangements for various occasions and investigate working possibilities within the industry. Candidates will build a digital portfolio of evidence and will be assessed via practical assessments and assignments. Research, homework and planning of approximately 2 hours per week is required to compile a portfolio of tasks.

UNITS/TOPICS COVERED:

Students are required to successfully complete 4 mandatory units. Health and Safety and working in the floral industry will be embedded throughout the course.

Students will develop basic skills in flower arranging craft and the underpinning knowledge of the craft process and basis for progression into further study in floristry. Students will learn how to use materials, tools, and equipment successfully and safely whilst gradually developing a portfolio of their practical floristry designs.

Students are required to successfully complete the following units:

- M/506/2674 Use materials, tools, and equipment to develop craft techniques (3 credits)
- K/506/2673 Investigate creative enterprise and employment opportunities (5 credits)
- H/506/2672 Develop craft ideas (4 credits)
- D/506/2679 Create, present, and evaluate final floral design (2 credits)

Student's portfolios will evidence achievement of all the learning outcomes and assessment criteria associated with each unit.









EQUIPMENT NEEDED:

Candidates will need approximately £15 a week for purchasing flowers, foliage, and decorative containers. Some equipment e.g., scissors, knife and basic stationary will be needed, this will be discussed at your induction. We have textbooks in class, in the library and available through our online portal, however you may wish to purchase your own, this will be discussed at induction. A good range of sundries are supplied by the college for you to use throughout your course.

WHERE CAN IT LEAD?

This course could lead to a career as a qualified self-employed/freelance florist or employment as a florist within the retail sector. You may wish to further your knowledge by taking additional floristry qualifications or other specialist floristry courses or workshops.
