



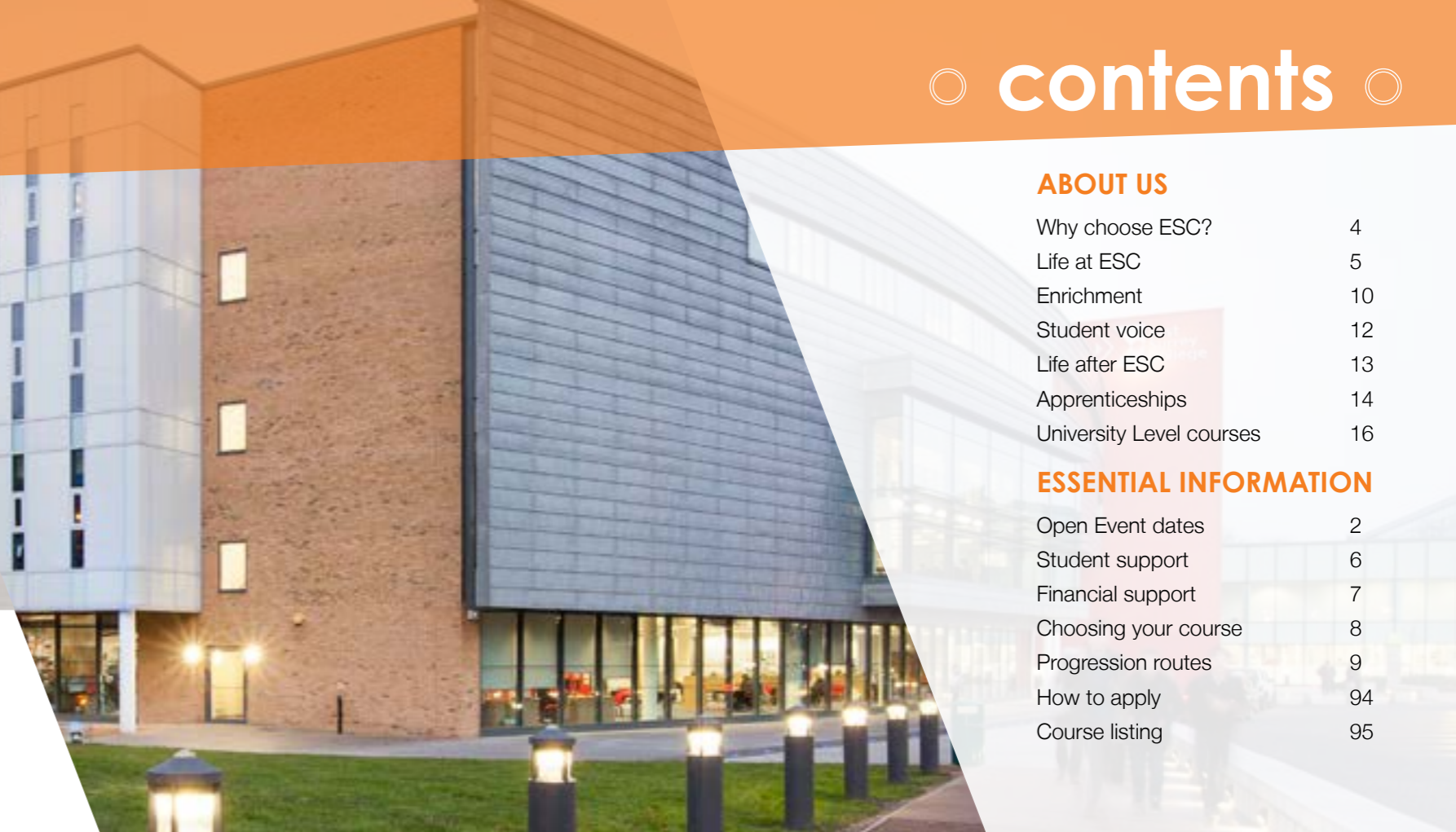

When you apply and enrol at ESC, our dedicated Client Services team will be available throughout the year to help and support you.

Impartial information, advice and guidance is offered in a variety of areas, including:

- Safeguarding and mentoring support

We are Matrix accredited and our staff are trained to nationally recognised standards, which means all enquiries will be dealt with impartially, confidentially and in a transparent way.

PERSONAL TUTOR

You will be allocated a personal tutor who will introduce you to the College, keep you informed about what's going on and most importantly, feed back to you on your progress and support you to achieve your full potential. Your personal tutor will help you set goals, give guidance and advice on careers (including Apprenticeships), Higher Education or job applications.

REACHING YOUR POTENTIAL

We believe you will reach your full potential if you make a real commitment to studying, and show respect for your fellow students, staff and the environment in which you study. To help this happen we ask students to sign up to and comply with the behaviour standards set out in the College Code of Conduct.

PLEASE LET US KNOW YOUR NEEDS BY TICKING THE APPROPRIATE BOXES ON THE APPLICATION FORM AND DISCUSSING THIS FULLY AT YOUR INTERVIEW.

NEED EXTRA HELP WITH YOUR STUDIES?

Additional support can be provided if you have a diagnosed learning difficulty or disability. If you have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) please provide this so that we can support your needs. We can provide:

- Access to assistive technology and software
- Assessments for exam access arrangements
- Dyslexia screening and recommend strategies for independent progress in learning
- Specialist support with hearing or visual impairments as well as speech and language needs

Students requiring additional support may be allocated a Learning Support Assistant to work with them in class or may be referred for specialist study support sessions.

We hold a successful autism spectrum support group where students socialise and try out new activities.

UNDER 19?

If you are under the age of 19 on 31 August 2020 and you meet the eligibility criteria your course is FREE.

You may be required to pay a resource fee and educational visit costs, however financial support is available for those who need it (subject to family income level).

19 AND OVER?

Depending on the qualifications you have already gained, tuition and/or exam fees may be payable.

If you are aged 19-23 (on 31 August of your starting year) and have not attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs 9-4/A*-C) or a Full Level 3 qualification (equivalent to 4 AS levels), then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees.

If you are aged 24 or older and have not yet attained a Full Level 2 qualification (5 GCSEs 9-4/A*-C) then you may not have to pay tuition or exam fees if study will enable you to progress into work or you are receiving JSA, ESA (WRAG), Universal Credit-mandated training or are on a low income.

If you are aged 19 or older and wish to study for a Level 3 or higher qualification, you will normally have to pay fees for each academic year of a course, or, if available you can apply for an Advanced Learner Loan. Advanced Learner Loans are in operation to provide financial support to adults who wish to study at Level 3 or higher. The loans are managed by the Student Loans Company who also manage the HE loans system. Further information can be found on the Student Loans Company website: www.slc.co.uk.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

Support may be available through a Bursary or other funding support scheme, contact our Student Bursary Adviser for more detailed information relevant to you.

Households receiving a low income and/or are in receipt of a means-tested benefit may be eligible for financial support. Application forms are available at www.esc.ac.uk or from our Client Services team who will assess your application to see if you are eligible for financial support. This could include help with: childcare costs, course equipment/resource fees, educational visits, lunches at college, travel expenses and uniforms.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS AND GCSE ENGLISH OR MATHS

These courses are offered free, except where you already hold a GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in the subject that you wish to study.

OTHER PAYMENT OPTIONS

Instalment plans for courses over £400 are available for over 18s, please contact Client Services for details.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

Develop your skills in English and Maths in real life situations. You can take a Functional Skills qualification at College if you are over 16 years of age, have left compulsory full-time education or do not have an up-to-date English or Maths qualification at Level 2 (such as a GCSE). Functional Skills are often a stepping stone to GCSEs and support progression to higher levels.

GCSE

The main qualifications taken by 14 to 16 year olds. Highly valued by schools, colleges and employers and useful whatever your future plans. Maths and English are particularly valued by employers and are important in enabling progression to higher levels.

ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)

If English isn't your first language, ESOL courses cover speaking, listening, reading, writing, vocabulary, punctuation and grammar. You will be assessed before starting your course to ensure you are placed on the right course level.

APPRENTICESHIP AND NVQ

An NVQ is an industry related qualification that you may study at College or at work as part of an Apprenticeship. You will learn practical, work-related tasks to help you develop skills and knowledge to do a job effectively. You will be assessed on your skills and knowledge to see the areas that need to be developed to complete your qualification.

BTEC

BTEC Level 2 Diplomas and Extended Certificates enable you to progress into employment or study at the higher level of the Subsidiary Diploma, 90 Credit Diploma or Extended Diploma. The Extended Diploma is equivalent to 3 A-Levels and is a preferred route for many to University. All qualifications have been designed in collaboration with industry, to equip you with the skills and knowledge that employers are looking for. The qualifications offer a mix of theory and practice and will include an element of work experience or a work-related project. They can take the form of (or be part of) a technical certificate, one of the key components of an Apprenticeship.

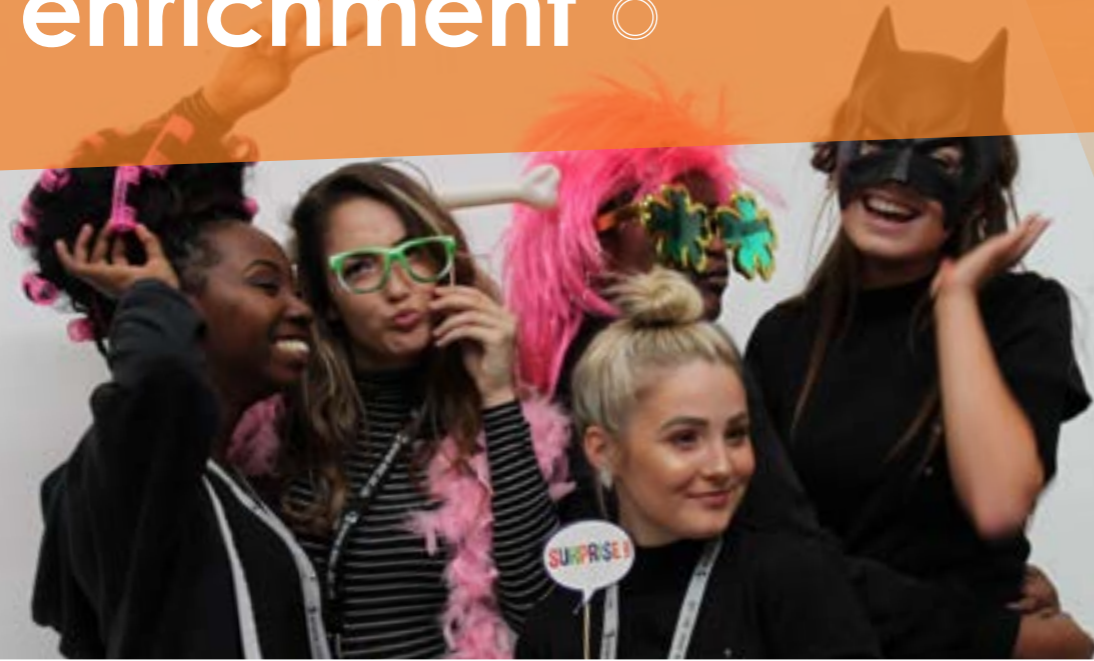

WHO CAN APPLY?

Anyone can apply for an Apprenticeship programme as long as they are aged 16+ at the start of their Apprenticeship programme. We can support you to find the right employer before you start an Apprenticeship.

WHAT'S INVOLVED?

Employers recognise and value an Apprenticeship as it is a nationally recognised programme and shows that you've been trained in the skills they need. Apprenticeships are designed by employers in the industry so they offer a structured programme that takes you through the skills needed to do a job well. Some of your training will be at College gaining the essential knowledge and skills relevant to your job role.

WHAT LEVELS ARE AVAILABLE?

- Intermediate Apprenticeships equivalent to five good GCSE passes
- Advanced Apprenticeships equivalent to two A-Level passes
- Higher Apprenticeships equivalent to a Level 4 or above qualification
- Degree Apprenticeships equivalent to a Level 6 or above qualification



TRAINEESHIPS

Traineeships are a good option for young people who are not quite ready to start an Apprenticeship or for those who are motivated to find employment but lack the skills and experience that employers are looking for. Progression from a Traineeship can include an Apprenticeship or other employment. Please see page 67 for full details.

Assessment: Continual assessment through a range of assignments

This course is designed for adults not already in possession of suitable Level 3 qualifications. The course is based around construction technology, site management and civil engineering professions. It is an approved route to higher level qualifications, training programmes, and University degrees within Engineering and Construction.

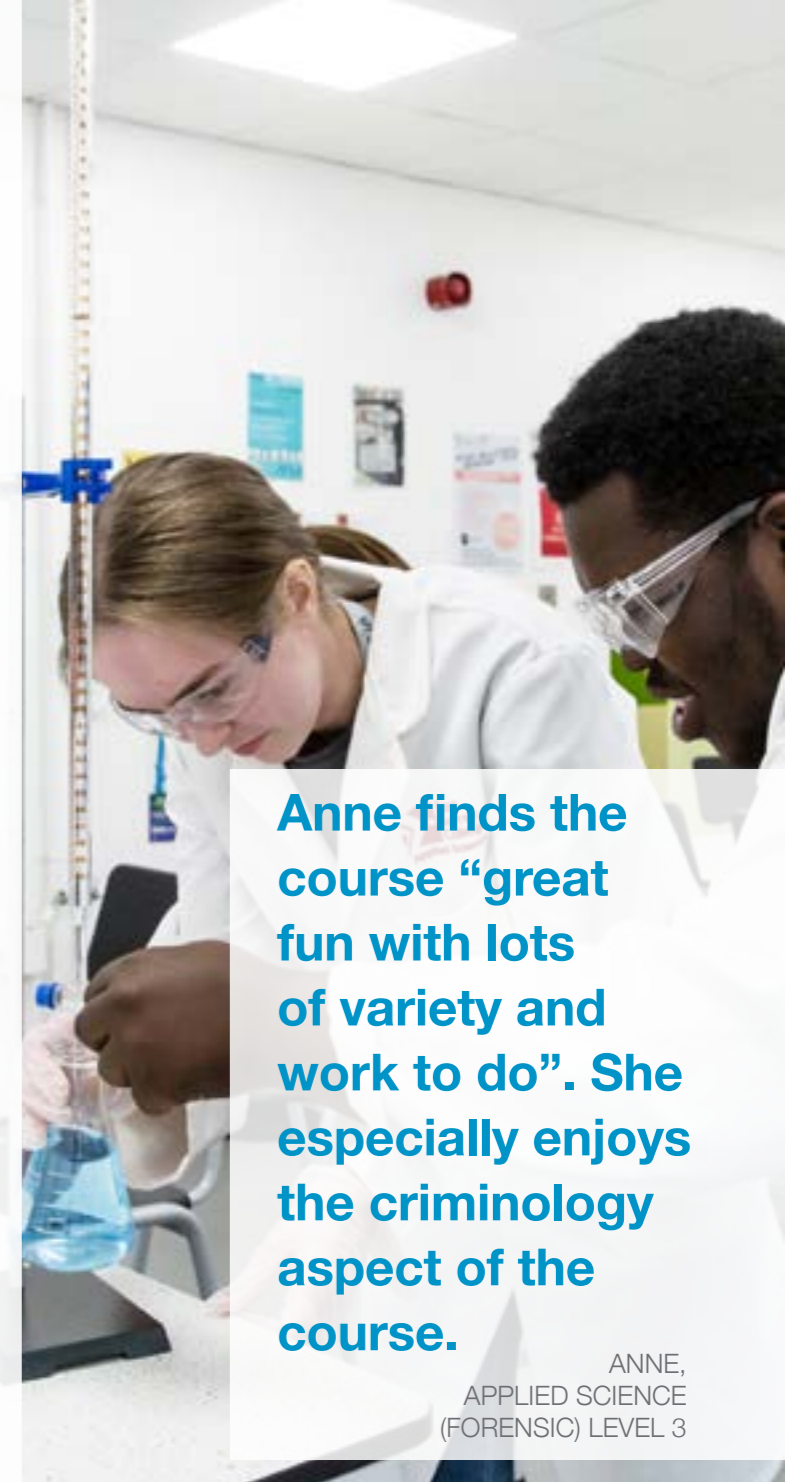

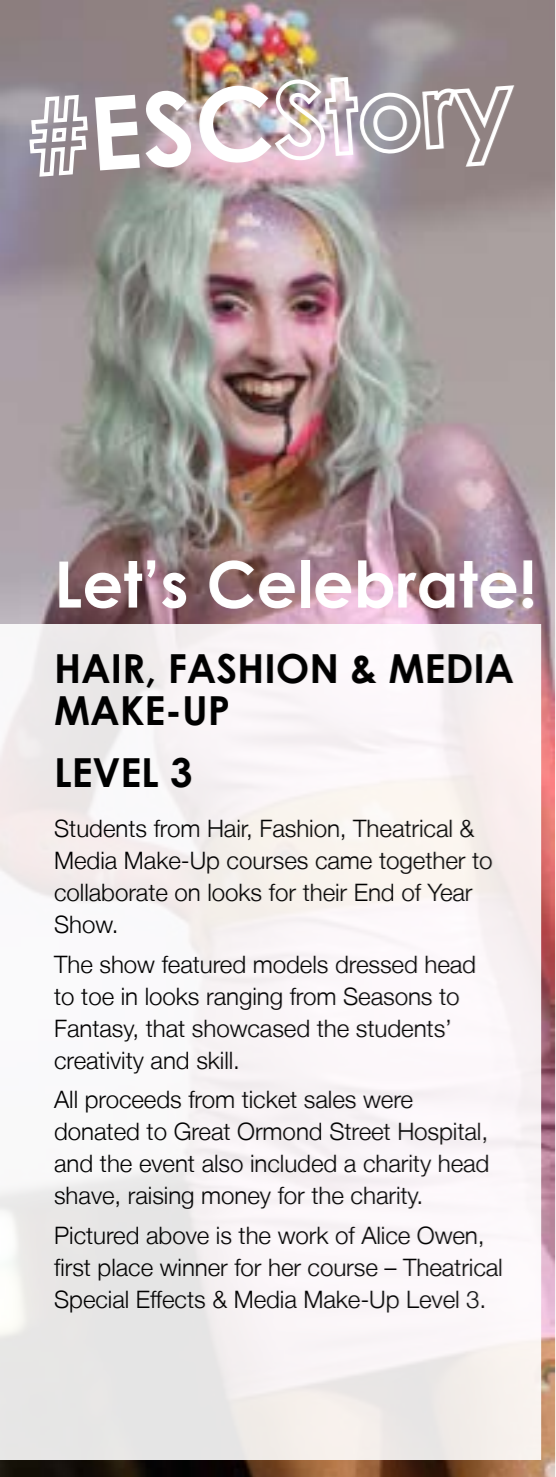

The students also took part in a Football tournament, and ran activities such as a raffle and hoop toss, in the lead up to the event. This counted as part of their 'Contributing to Running an Event' module, and all money raised goes towards YMCA East Surrey's community projects.

Their final fundraising total was over £500!

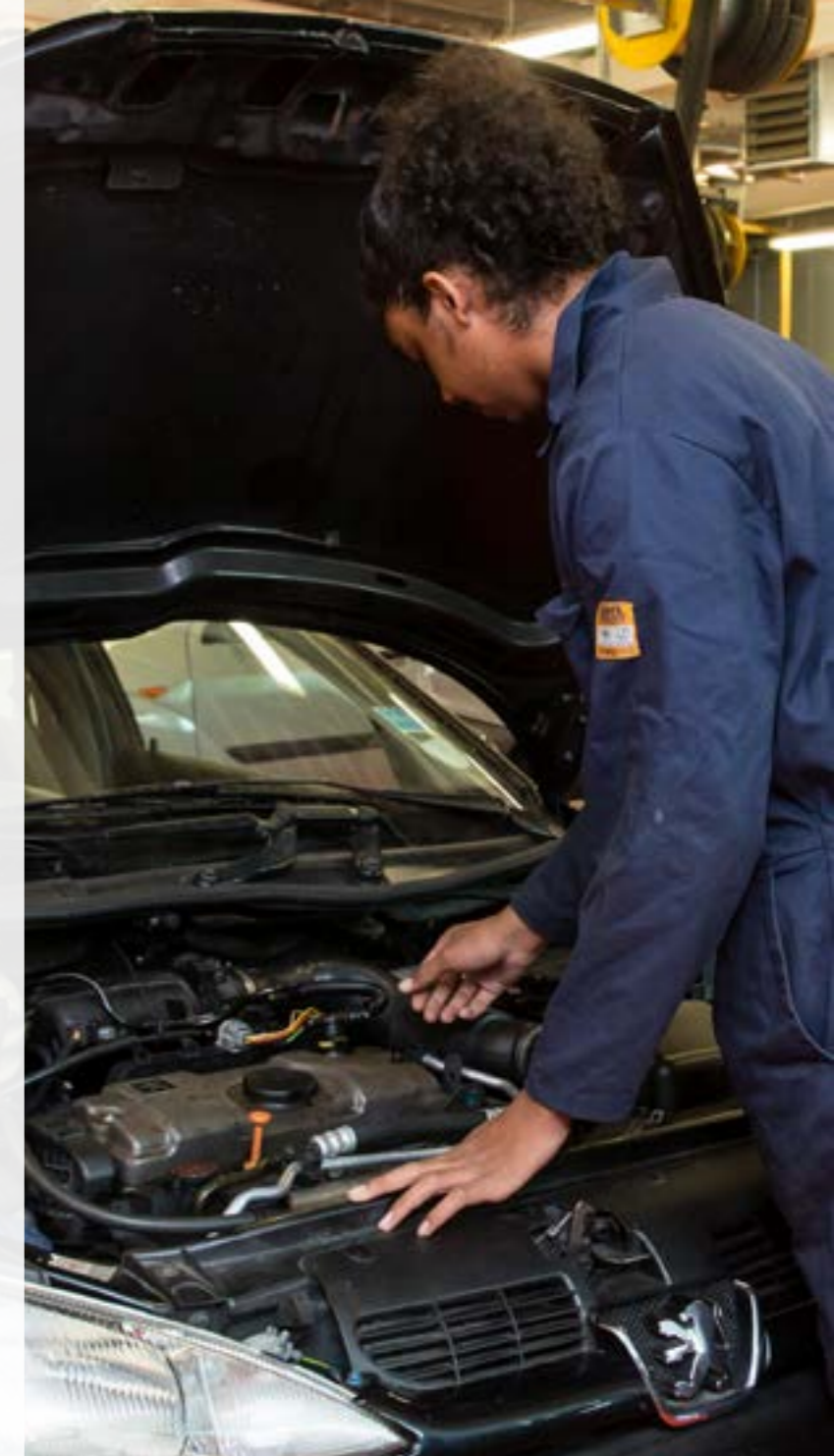
